Graduation Planning

- Ohio Revised Code 3313.617
- All school districts must have "policy for students at risk of not qualifying for high school diploma"
- As a part of this policy, all students in grades 9-12 must have a "graduation plan"
- A graduation plan must:
 - 1. Address a student's plan to meet graduation requirements;
 - 2. Be developed jointly by student and school district representative and updated annually; and
 - 3. Be included as a criterion for identifying students as at-risk for not graduating.

POST-HIGH SCHOOL GOALS

Goal: Pursue a career in the Air Force

Supports needed to achieve this goal: Achieve admission requirements for the Air Force, which include 36 on ASVAB test, physical evaluation, health & drug screen.

Ohio's Long-Term Graduation Requirements

Students must meet requirements in all three areas



1. Course Requirements



2. Demonstration of Competency



3. Demonstration of Readiness

1. Course Requirements

General Course Requirements	State Minimum
English language arts	4 units
Health	½ unit
Mathematics	4 units
Physical education	½ unit
Science	3 units
Social studies	3 units
<u>Electives</u>	5 units

Districts may require more than the minimum 20 credits as a local decision.

Students must receive instruction in **economics** and **financial literacy** (in high school) and complete at least **two semesters of fine arts*** (during grades 7-12).

*Fine arts may not be required for students in a career-tech program unless it is a component of local course requirements.

Financial Literacy Requirement

- Classes of 2023-2025: Financial literacy instruction is required for students to graduate. School districts determine how and when students meet this requirement.
- Class of 2026 and Beyond: For students entering high school for the first time on or after July 1, 2022, one-half credit of financial literacy that students can substitute for a one-half credit elective, or a one-half credit of math required for graduation. The one-half credit of math cannot be Algebra 1 (or Math 1 if using an integrated approach), Geometry (or Math 2 if using an integrated approach), Advanced Computer Science or Algebra 2.

Competency Alternative: Military

Requirements:

- Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S Armed forces;
 - All branches offer a Delayed Entry program

Option 2: Military Enlistment ASVAB Test: A student must earn the required score for the branch the student wishes to enter to receive a DD Form 4 enlistment contract. Competency Alternative: Career Readiness

Complete 2 demonstrations to show competency, at least 1 must be a foundational option

Foundational Demonstration

- Cumulative score of proficient or higher on 3 or more WebXams in single career pathway
- Earn a 12-pt. approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 pt. in one career field
- Earn a State issued license in a vocation that requires an examination
- Pre-apprenticeship or apprenticeship program
 - Registered with Ohio State Apprenticeship Council

- Complete 250-hours Work-based Learning
- Earn workforce readiness score on WorkKeys
- Earn the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal



State Defined Seal: Military Enlistment

Options to earn seal:

- o Provide evidence of enlistment in an armed services branch of the military; **OR**
- Participating in an approved Junior Reserve Officer Training (JROTC) program
 - o Find additional information and locate a JROTC program near you here.



State Defined Seal: Industry- Recognized Credential

Options to earn seal:

- Earn 12 points of industry-recognized credential that is aligned to a job that is determined to be "in-demand" in this state and its regions; OR
- Earn a group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field
- Obtaining a state-issued license for a practice in a vocation that requires an examination

Name of Seal (1): Industry-Recognized Credential

How the student will earn the seal: Completion of STNA Industry-Recognized Credential Seal- Passed 75 hours NATCEP(Nurse Aide Training and Competency Evaluation) test with 80% or higher.

State Defined Seal: OhioMeansJobs Readiness

Requirements:

- Demonstrate proficiency in each of 15 identified professional skills;
- Use the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal Form to record demonstration of each professional skill;
- O Work with a mentor (3) to validate (confirm) each skill across a minimum of *two* of the three environments
 - ✓ Community: Volunteer coordinators, faith-based leaders & others
 - ✓ Work: Supervisors, hiring managers, experienced co-workers & others
 - ✓ School: Teachers, administrators, advisors, coaches & others

Name of Seal (2): OMJ Readiness Seal

How the student will earn the seal: Work Mentor- worked front desk at local hospital. Community Mentor- volunteered at local church teaching youth groups. School Mentor: Baseball coach for 3 years

Requirements: Students must earn remediation-free scores on the ACT or SAT, as outlined below.

State Defined Seal: Technology

Options to earn seal:

- Earn a score equivalent to proficient "2" on an appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate test; OR
- Earning a "B" or higher in an approved College Credit Plus course; OR
- o Completing a course that meets guidelines set by the Ohio Department of Education



State Defined Seal: Citizenship

Options to earn seal:


American History

- Earn a score of proficient "3" on Ohio's State Test in American History
- Earn a final course grade equivalent to a "B" or higher in
 American History
- Earn a score equivalent to proficient "2" on Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate test in US History
- Earn a "B" or higher in American History College Credit Plus course.

American Government

- Earn a score of proficient "3" on Ohio's State Test in American Government
- Earn a final course grade equivalent to a "**B**" or higher in American Government
- Earn a score equivalent to proficient "2" on Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate test in US Government
- Earn a "B" or higher in American Government College
 Credit Plus course.

OR: Earn a score of **Basic** (457) or higher on Social Studies Alternate Assessment for Students with the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities



State Defined Seal: Science

Options to earn seal:

- oEarn a score of proficient "3" on Ohio's State Test in Biology; OR
- oEarn a final course grade equivalent to a "B" or higher in an advanced science course
- Earn a score equivalent to proficient "2" on an appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate science test; OR
- Earn a "B" or higher in a College Credit Plus science course.
- oEarn a score of **Basic** (430) or higher on Science Alternate Assessment for Students with the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities

How the student will earn the seal: Earned a score of 743 on end-of-course exam in biology

State Defined Seal: Biliteracy

Requirements:

Students must demonstrate proficiency in English and high levels of proficiency in at least **one** other world language

 Students can demonstrate proficiency in English and at least one other world language through a series of test-based options

State Defined Seal: Biliteracy

English Proficiency Requirements

Meet one of the following:

- Proficient level on English language arts: ELA I & ELA II and just ELA II for graduates of the Class of 2023 and beyond);
- Remediation-free scores on the English and reading sections of one of the state-recognized college readiness examinations (currently the ACT or SAT English and reading sections);
- Earn a proficient level or higher on a Department-approved alternative assessment (currently the Iowa and TerraNova Tests); or
- Earn a score of proficient on the high school Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment (OELPA).

Foreign Language Requirements

Meet one of the following:

- Pass an AP foreign language examination with a score of 4 or higher;
 or
- Pass an I.B. foreign language examination with a score of 5 or higher (Higher Level) or 6 or higher (Standard Level); or
- Attain a score of Intermediate High or higher (http://www.actfl.org/)
 in comprehension, speaking, reading and writing the language, using
 Department-approved assessments; or
- Qualify for proficiency-based credits through Ohio's credit flex program and attain a score of Intermediate High or higher (ACTFL) in comprehension, speaking, reading and writing using Departmentapproved assessments; or
- Earn a score equivalent to Intermediate High or higher (ACTFL) in interpersonal signing, presentational signing and demonstrating understanding of American Sign Language (ASL) on an ASL assessment approved by the Ohio Department of Education; or
- Attain a score equivalent to Intermediate High or higher (ACTFL) in interpretive reading and presentational writing on a classical language assessment approved by the Ohio Department of Education.



State Defined Seal: Honors Diploma

Requirements:

To receive the Honors Seal, students must earn one of six honors diploma Seals outlined below:

- Academic Honors Diploma;
- Career-Tech Honors Diploma;
- International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma;
- STEM Honors Diploma;
- Arts Honors Diploma;
- Civics and Social Sciences Honors Diploma
- Honors Diploma Criteria

Community Service: Completion of a community service project that is aligned with the guidelines adopted by the student's district board or school governing authority.



Student Engagement: Participation in extracurricular activities to a meaningful extent, as determined by local guidelines. Activities can include: Athletics, Clubs & Student government.



Fine and Performing Arts: Demonstration of skill in the fine or performing arts according to an evaluation that is aligned with the guidelines adopted by the student's district board or school governing authority.

Out-of-State Transfer Students

- Must test in Algebra I and English Language Arts II to demonstrate competency.
 - -Senior transfer students are exempt from testing twice before moving onto alternative demonstrations

 Must earn two seals, one being a State defined seal..
 Students can use previous course work to earn the technology, science, citizenship and locally defined seals.










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
